

What is CHIP?

The **CH**ild **I**dentification **P**rogram (**CHIP**) addresses the alarming fact that over 1,000,000 children are reported missing in the United States each year. In 2005, over 2,000 children were reported missing in Nebraska. While most are found, many are not. Also, the abduction of children is both under-reported and rapidly increasing in our society.

The Masonic CHIP Kit is the most comprehensive service of its kind anywhere. CHIP is provided at no charge to the public and all of the identifying items generated during CHIP are given to the child's family.

The CHIP Kit includes the following:

Video Interview: A brief interview is worth a thousand still photos. The CHIP interview captures the appearance, speech, mannerisms, and other important personal characteristics of a child. The interview, downloaded to a CD, can be quickly distributed via the media to reach a huge audience. It is the cornerstone of CHIP.

Fingerprints: Fingerprinting is a well-known means of identification. Everyone's prints are unique. Resourceful parents keep fingerprints available should the need arise.

Toothprints® bite impression is quick and easy. Teeth, like fingerprints, are unique. Even in a child who is losing and gaining teeth, a dental imprint gives both accurate and important information for identification purposes. Saliva on the Toothprint® also serves as a DNA sample for at least 3 years, but more importantly, serves as a scent tracer for recovery bloodhound dogs that can easily track saliva scent.

DNA Cheek Swab: The cheek swab provides DNA material for both mitochondrial and nuclear DNA matching for more than 20 years when properly frozen in a home freezer.

Still Photograph: If needed, a current photograph is an invaluable tool for an Amber Alert or for use by the proper authorities.

Scent Pad Kit: Materials are provided for at-home generation of scent articles. A scent pad collects skin cells as they are shed from the body. The scent produced by those skin cells is unique to each person. A properly obtained and stored scent pad is one of the purest scent articles that can be provided to a search and rescue dog. The Masonic CHIP Kit is provided at no charge to the children. Only the permission slip is retained by the Freemasons. No copies of any ID materials are kept on file by any of the organizers; the parents receive all ID materials and health information produced.

History of CHIP

CHIP is being offered by Masons in 20 states. The program began in New York in 1994. It provided a videotaped interview giving far more information than other identification programs utilizing a single photo. Fingerprinting was also included.

In 1998, Dr. David Harte, a Massachusetts Mason, brought Toothprints®, a technique developed by Dr. David Tesini, a Massachusetts children's dentist, to CHIP. Its addition made CHIP the most thorough child identification program available. Accordingly, to provide the licensed personnel needed to administer Toothprints® and the DNA cheek swabs, the Freemasons in states offering the program joined with their statewide dental associations.

Fingerprinting, likewise, is best done by trained personnel. State law enforcement agencies have also

been brought in as partners in CHIP. These dedicated officers provide expertise in fingerprinting and practical experience so important in making CHIP more effective.
